Transport Routes

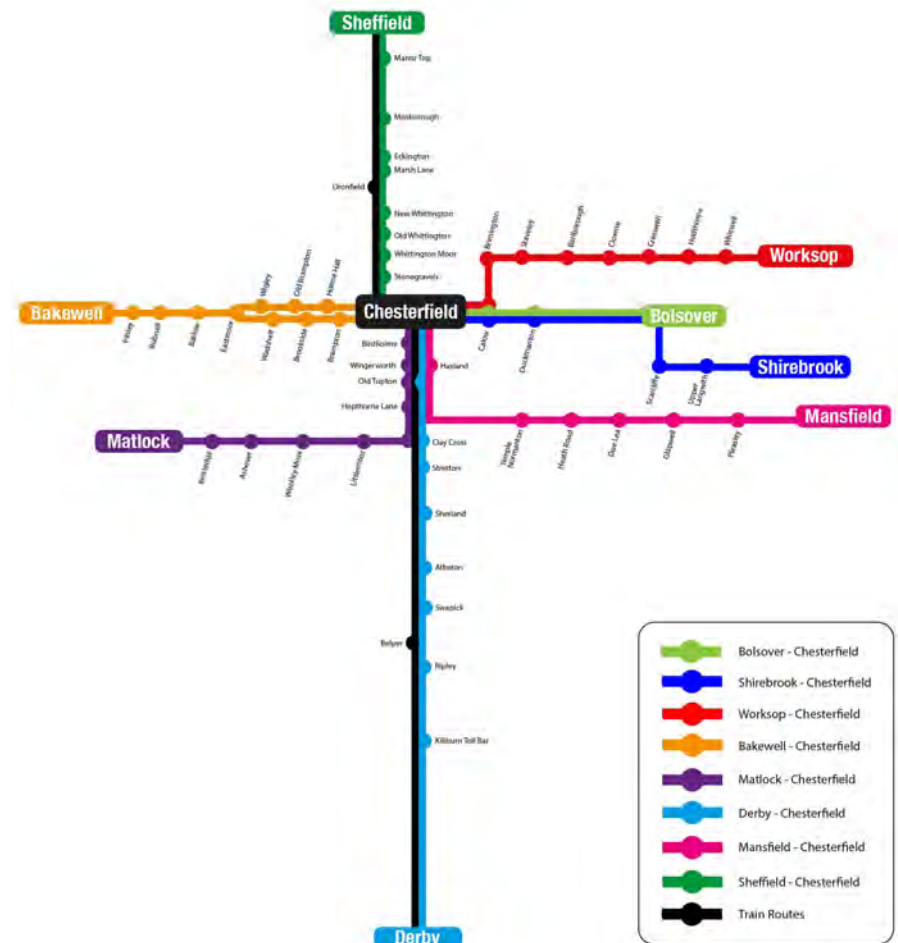


Bus - There are a number of public transport companies that have buses running directly into the town centre, which is just a short walk from college.

Train - Our campus is just around the corner from Chesterfield train station. You can catch regular trains from Sheffield, Derby, Nottingham and surrounding areas.

A Levels

A Levels are academic qualifications which are traditionally used to progress to university-level study but can provide a route into apprenticeships as well. With A Levels you can choose to study three or four different subjects at a time. A Levels are studied over two years and are assessed by exams and coursework. At Chesterfield College we have over 15 different A Levels to choose from.

Vocational Qualifications

Vocational qualifications are study programmes which focus on one subject area. At college we have a huge range of vocational qualifications to choose from including art, hair and beauty, business, construction, sport, vehicle technology and many, many more. A vocational study programme is often divided into hands-on industry experience and theory work in the classroom.

T Levels

(Also known as technical qualifications) are a new type of qualification which will soon be rolled out in colleges across the country. T Levels are designed for 16-18 year olds who prefer to take a practical approach to learning and will, over time, replace vocational study programmes.

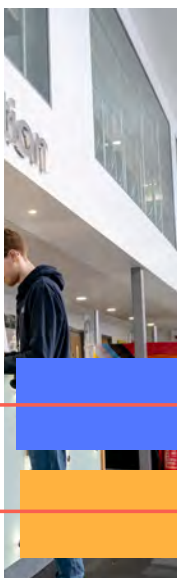
Apprenticeship

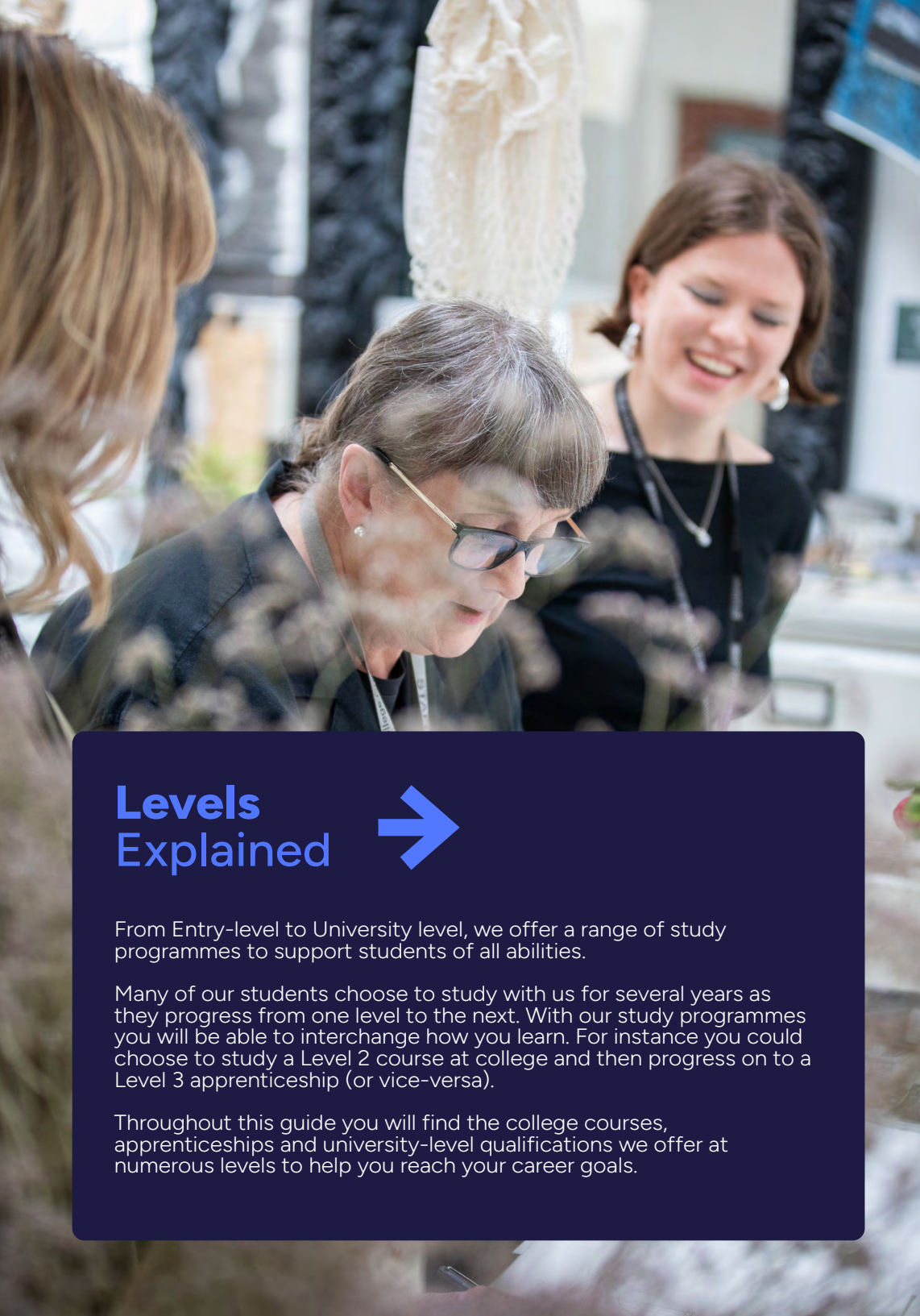

Levels Explained

From Entry-level to University level, we offer a range of study programmes to support students of all abilities.

Many of our students choose to study with us for several years as they progress from one level to the next. With our study programmes you will be able to interchange how you learn. For instance you could choose to study a Level 2 course at college and then progress on to a Level 3 apprenticeship (or vice-versa).

Throughout this guide you will find the college courses, apprenticeships and university-level qualifications we offer at numerous levels to help you reach your career goals.

There are lots of different options available to you at college so we understand that it can be a little overwhelming deciding what to do after school. Whether you want to be an accountant or an artist, beautician or builder; we have the study programme to help you get where you want to be in life.

T Levels have been designed by the Government with employers, to make sure you walk away with your qualification and all the current skills and knowledge you need to get on the job market and start your career! This two-year qualification for 16-18 year olds, combines industry experience with classroom study, think of it as a mixture of apprenticeships, A Levels and vocational qualifications.

You'll spend 45 days on an Industry Placement where you'll get to put your skills into practice with the help of a local employer.

**T Levels

know**



A T Level is a two-year long qualification and during that time students will spend most of their time working in the classroom but will also partake in a 45-day placement in a local business.

A T Level Distinction* qualification is worth the same amount of UCAS points as 3 A Levels at A* or a BTEC Level 3 qualification at D*D*D* meaning you get to study one course for the price of three!

Students will get the opportunity to use state-of-the-art equipment to develop skills that are used in industry.

What are T-levels?

Your Study Programme

As one of our students you will be enrolled onto a tailored study programme which consists of different elements you are required to complete during your time at college. Your study programme will depend on your existing qualifications, the level you are studying at and the career path you are following.

A study programme consists of:

Your Qualification

The course you are studying will make up the majority of your study programme.

However, you may also be expected to incorporate other elements into your studies.



English and Maths

You may not think so now, but we cannot stress enough how important English and math skills are. It's a competitive world out there and employers, in all industries, favour those with a good standard of English and maths. Therefore, if you didn't achieve at least a grade 4 during your GCSEs then you'll continue to study these essential subjects alongside your course.



Work Experience / Industry Placements

We want you to get off to a great start when you leave us, so it's important to undergo a work experience placement of at least 30 hours during your studies. These placements will provide you with a realistic view of the world of work and will allow you to develop the employability skills you need for the future. Some study programmes have longer industry placements which require up to 315 hours in a work environment.



College Life

College isn't just about studying; we want your time here to be fun and one that you'll remember. We offer lots of exciting enrichment opportunities for you to get involved in. 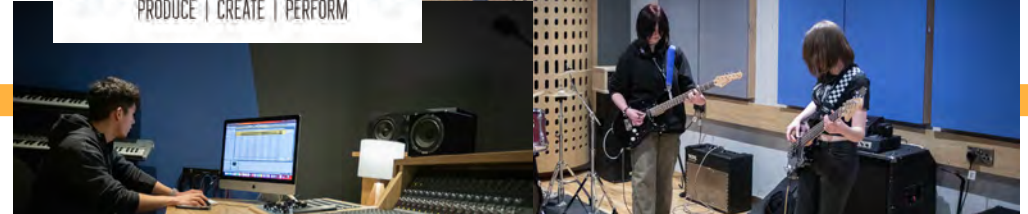
Digital Centre

Fees and Funding

16-18 Year Old?

If you're aged 16-18, your full-time college study programme is free (although you may have to pay for course materials, uniforms or trips).

Discretionary Learner Support

Chesterfield College is able to support some students with up to 75% of their course cost where other forms of funding are unavailable. Please call us to discuss your individual circumstances.

Financial Support & Bursaries

16-19 Bursary

If you're aged between 16-19 and your family household income is less than £28,000 per year (£40,000 for support with travel only), you could be eligible to financial help such as subsidised travel, free meals and contributions towards course materials.

Vulnerable Young Person Bursary

You could be eligible for this bursary if you are aged 16-19, in care, a care leaver, living independently (in receipt of certain benefits) or have children of your own.

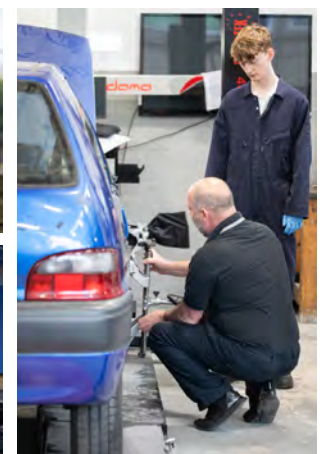

There are questions about disability on the application form. If you answer these accurately it helps us to make things fair for you when you start college. If you have an Education Health and Care Plan, we will then get a copy from the Local Authority and check whether we can meet your support needs in college.
