



Entry requirements



Level 2 – GCSE study requires an applicant to have 5 GCSEs at grade 3 (minimum)



Level 3 — A-level study requires an applicant to have 5 GCSEs at grade 5 or above with a 6 in one of the English subjects



Some specific subject areas will require additional grade entry, e.g. Psychology requires a 6 in Maths



Levels of study

The level students start on depends upon their prior qualification and experience.

- Level 2 (1 Year) GCSE's: Sociology, Psychology, Biology, Maths and English
- Level 3 (2 Years) A-level: 3 x A-levels

Progression opportunities:

- University
- Higher level apprenticeships
- Internal progression within Chesterfield College access to higher education courses

Example careers

Law and Criminology: Solicitor, Lawyer, Forensic Scientist, Crime Scene Investigator, Police/Detective

Humanities: Archeologist, Geologist, Historian

Sciences: Environmentalist, Doctors/Dentist, Veterinary, Surgeons/Nurses

Social Sciences: Psychologist, Social worker, Therapist, Youth worker

English and Media: Journalist, Editor, TV/Radio presenter, Author, Games designer

Business and Mathematical: Business owners, Accountancy, Cyber Crime Investigator

Next Steps

Provider

After your interview, one of the three things will happen.

1. You will be offered a conditional place on one of our courses.

If this is the case your next steps will involve attending a variety of keep in touch/taster days throughout the year here at College. You would be expected to complete some summer bridging work for each subject.

2. Referral to careers

If at the end of your interview, you decide the course you have applied for is not right for you then you will be referred to our careers team who can support you I finding an alternative course on programme. There is so much for you to choose from, and our team can talk to you through all the available options.

3. Referral to a different subject area

If you decide at the end of your interview that you would like to apply and participate in an interview for a different course, let the interviewer know and they can arrange this for you immediately.
